NAME: City of Seaford – Disparate #2018-

TITLE OF PROJECT: Equipment/Weapons Upgrade

GOALS OF PROJECT: To upgrade/replace aging shotguns currently in the Department's inventory with rifles for greater precision, capacity, and range.

DESCRIPTION OF STRATEGIES: The Department's aging shotgun inventory, purchased over 20 years ago, is creating a greater need and expense in service and maintenance. The project funded with JAG funds will provide rifles for our patrol officers for use in any potential dangerous/deadly force situation such as active shooter scenarios. In addition to providing accuracy at long distances, they provide safety in low-light situations and contribute to the safe resolution and risk to the officer and the public due to advanced technology. The purchase of this equipment is essential to our Mission Statement and goal of keeping the citizens of this community safe.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE DELAWARE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL, FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BRANCH, FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE WASTEWATER MATCHING PLANNING GRANT IN ORDER TO RECEIVE UP TO \$56,800 (\$28,400 IN LOCAL FUNDS AND \$28,400 IN GRANT FUNDS), 50% MATCH REQUIRED, TO DEVELOP A SET OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS SUITABLE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDDING TO EXTEND AN EIGHT (8) INCH GRAVITY SEWER MAIN SOUTH ON ROUTE 13 (SUSSEX HIGHWAY) APPROXIMATELY ONE THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED (1,400) LINEAR FEET AND ALSO EXTEND AN EIGHT (8) INCH GRAVITY SEWER MAIN EAST ON MIDDLEFORD ROAD APPROXIMATELY TWO THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED, AND FIFTY (2,150) LINEAR FEET. THE PURPOSE OF BOTH SEWER MAIN EXTENSIONS IS TO PROVIDE SEPTIC ELIMINATIONS WITHIN COMMERCIAL AREAS ALONG THE MIDDLEFORD ROAD CORRIDOR BETWEEN RIVERSIDE DRIVE AND SUSSEX HIGHWAY AND ALONG SUSSEX HIGHWAY BETWEEN MIDDLEFORD ROAD AND THE NANTICOKE RIVER.

WHEREAS, the City of Seaford (hereinafter "City") recently received notice from the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, Financial Assistance Branch (hereinafter "DNREC FAB") that it is accepting applications from county and municipal governments for participation in DNREC FAB's Wastewater Matching Planning Grant (hereinafter "Grant"); and

WHEREAS, the Grant provides participants an opportunity to receive funding to develop a set of plans and specifications suitable for competitive bidding to extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main south on route 13 (Sussex Highway) approximately one thousand, four hundred (1,400) linear feet and also extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main east on Middleford Road approximately two thousand, one hundred, and fifty (2,150) linear feet. the purpose of both sewer main extensions is to provide septic eliminations within commercial areas along the Middleford Road corridor between Riverside Drive and Sussex Highway and along Sussex Highway between Middleford Road and the Nanticoke River; and

WHEREAS, the funding and financial incentives available to participants through the Grant include: up to \$56,800.00 (\$28,400 in local funds and \$28,400 in grant funds) with a 50% match required, the grant funds will be used to develop and implement planning level studies; and

WHEREAS, applications for participation in the Grant may be submitted at any time during the year, and applicants will be recommended for funding by the Delaware Water Infrastructure Advisory Council on a first-come, first-serve basis, based upon receipt of an approved application meeting all requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Seaford believe that it is in the best interest of the City to submit an application for participation in the Grant so that the City might receive the funding and financial incentives described above, specifically up to \$56,800.00 (\$28,400 in local funds and \$28,400 in grant funds), 50% match required, funding to develop a set of plans and specifications suitable for competitive bidding to extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main south on Route 13 (Sussex Highway) approximately one thousand, four hundred (1,400) linear feet and also extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main east on Middleford Road approximately two thousand, one hundred, and fifty (2,150) linear feet. the purpose of both sewer main extensions is to provide septic eliminations within commercial areas along the Middleford Road corridor between Riverside Drive and Sussex Highway and along Sussex Highway between Middleford Road and the Nanticoke River.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AND DETERMINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Seaford, in session met, a quorum pertaining at all times

thereto, that the preparation and submission of an application for participation in DNREC FAB's Wastewater Matching Planning Grant to receive up to \$56,800.00 (\$28,400 in local funds and \$28,400 in grant funds), 50% match required, to obtain funding to develop a set of plans and specifications suitable for competitive bidding to extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main south on Route 13 (Sussex Highway) approximately one thousand, four hundred (1,400) linear feet and also extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main east on Middleford Road approximately two thousand, one hundred, and fifty (2,150) linear feet. the purpose of both sewer main extensions is to provide septic eliminations within commercial areas along the Middleford Road corridor between riverside drive and Sussex Highway and along Sussex Highway between Middelford Road and the Nanticoke River.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED, that the City (upon grant award) intends to retain the professional engineering and consulting services of George, Miles & Buhr, to develop a set of plans and specifications suitable for competitive bidding to extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main south on Route 13 (Sussex Highway) approximately one thousand, four hundred (1,400) linear feet and also extend an eight (8) inch gravity sewer main east on Middleford Road approximately two thousand, one hundred, and fifty (2,150) linear feet. the purpose of both sewer main extensions is to provide septic eliminations within commercial areas along the Middleford Road corridor between Riverside Drive and Sussex Highway and along Sussex Highway between Middelford Road and the Nanticoke River.



Safety Shoe Policy **Adopted:**

Purpose:

The purpose of the safety shoe policy is to standardize and provide guidelines for the purchase of utility boots and safety shoes for code, parks, and utility personnel.

Policy:

All code, parks, and utility personnel are authorized a set allotment for safety boots and shoes as needed for the department in which they work. The requirements for each department are as follows:

- Code - Safety toe (steel or composite) boot or shoe
- Electric - Linemen - Safety toe (steel or composite), steel or composite shank, electric hazard rated, 6" boot
- Electric - Director, Operations Coordinator, and Technical Leader - Safety toe (steel or composite), electric hazard rated shoe at a minimum
- Parks - Safety toe (steel or composite) boot
- Public Works - Director - Safety toe (steel or composite) boot or shoe
- Public Works - All other employees - Safety toe (steel or composite) boot
- Wastewater - Safety toe (steel or composite) boot

The allowance provides for a pair of boots for each employee on an as-needed basis, not an annual or semi-annual basis. The employee's supervisor will determine if the boots are damaged beyond repair due to work conditions, and make the decision as to whether a new pair is warranted at the city's expense. Provision of boots will not exceed two pairs per year.

Implementation:

Safety shoes are only to be purchased through the following approved vendors where the city has an existing account. There will be **NO** employee reimbursements.

- Lehigh Outfitters
- Saf-Gard
- Tractor Supply

The department allowances are as follows:

- Electric - \$200
- All other departments - \$150

These amounts will be reviewed periodically and adjusted for inflation, if necessary.

Shoe Reimbursement Policy

Adopted: 08/15/02

Purpose:

The purpose of the Shoe reimbursement policy is to standardize and provide guidelines for the purchase of utility boots and shoes for utility and code personnel.

Policy:

All utility and code personnel are authorized a set allotment for boots and shoes as needed for the department in which they work. This allowance provides one pair of boots per year unless damaged beyond repair due to work conditions, and in this case the employee's supervisor will make the decision as to whether a new pair is warranted at the City's expense.

Implementation:

- This amount will be adjusted every January according to the cost of living adjustment. Please contact the HR Department for current allotments.
- If the employee goes over the allotment then they are responsible to pay the difference.
- The employee will not receive the boots until the additional amount is paid in full.





The 911 Center is requesting \$6,406.00 for the cost of the equipment to be installed for WIFI. This will enable the 911 Center to hold in house training at our facility which will save on travel expense costs.

The 911 Center is also requesting that some of the old infrastructure be replaced that is affecting our network communications. The equipment for this project has a cost of \$8,369.43. City I.T and Deljis have advised us that our Network switches need to be upgraded. At this time we are constantly having Comcast outages which are due to old Network switches.
