

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
CITY OF SEAFORD ANTIQUE FIRE TRUCK RESTORATION COMMITTEE

March 10th, 2022

7:00 PM

Committee Chair and Councilman Dan Henderson called the Antique Fire Truck Restoration Meeting to order with the following people present: Wayne Rigby, John Botdorf, Ric Marvel, Ron Marvel, Mark O'Bier, Randall O'Bier, and Barry Calhoun.

Councilman Henderson presented New Business #1 – Discuss the status of Engine #1. Councilman Henderson stated that he understands a meeting has not been held with the committee for some time and believes there should be some discussion regarding maintenance needs for Engine #1. He noted there may be an opportunity for state funding to assist with restorations if estimates can be obtained within the next two to three weeks.

Those present discussed the replacement of Engine #1's radiator, which at last estimate would be around \$8,000.00. Councilman Henderson noted two estimates would need to be produced and submitted by early April for the radiator repairs. He added it could be possible to submit separate requests if other maintenance needs arise. He suggested renewing the previous proposal and reaching out to other municipalities for contact information for vendors who specialize in fire truck restoration.

Mr. Ron Marvel suggested the Committee reconvene once the information is collected; Councilman Henderson agreed.

Mr. Ric Marvel asked Councilman Henderson to thank the City for cleaning the parking lot last Saturday. He stated it had not been done in over a year, and it makes a big difference. He then noted the ceiling in the Fire Museum needed to be repaired, including the replacement of some of the drywall.

Mr. O'Bier asked if the roof is still leaking; Mr. Marvel said he believed so. Councilman Henderson asked if there had been any major leaks with the recent weather events. Mr. O'Bier and Mr. Ric Marvel agreed to assess the roof after the meeting ended. Councilman Henderson stated he would look into available funds through the City's GMB Rental Account to help with roof repairs.

He then asked those present if there had been any more discussion on the need for security upgrades since the last meeting. Mr. O'Bier stated it might be prudent to see if it's possible to tie into an existing system with GMB or the City.

With no further questions or comments, Councilman Henderson asked for a motion to adjourn. Mr. O'Bier moved to close the meeting; Mr. Barry Calhoun seconded the motion. The motion so passed with all present voting in favor. Councilman Henderson adjourned the meeting at 7:23 pm.
